Dear Student/Parent,

Please take note of the following in relation to the remaining weeks of online T. & L., end of year assessments and some general information. I hope students are coping well and still working with teachers online.

Student T. & L. Online.

We have given out 8 Laptops on loan to sixth year students this week who were having difficulty accessing a proper device for school work. While the grant is specifically for L.C. students, we would try to assist parents of students in other year groups if possible. Priority to 5th and 3rd. Parents should email principal@heywood.ie

A letter will be sent out to parents this coming week of students not engaging in any online school work based on teacher feedback. Advice to teachers is to stay working with those that are engaged. Parents are asked to ensure that students engage in the teaching and guidance being provided or to inform the school why students cannot engage. In this way we may be able to support one another.

End of Year Assessments.

We had a Google Meet meeting with Subject Coordinators on Thursday 30th April. We decided that the end of year assessment for 1st, 2nd & 5th yrs. will consist of the following three components;

70% as an assessment mark based on the Christmas exam, Classroom Based Assessments and Mid-term Assessments completed during the school year 2019/20 up until March 12th 2020. 15% based on the quality of online engagement by each student from March 12th 2020 until the return to school or the end of the school year.

15% for an end of Summer-term assessment to be set by Subject Departments/teachers. The Summer-term assessment may take the form of a set of short questions completed and submitted by students online (There are lots of options.), or an open book one hour exam with students given three hours to complete it or a more comprehensive open book exam (Senior stdents??) with 48hrs. to complete and submit. Decisions per subject will be communicated to students next week.

It is intended to draw up a timetable for these exams over 10 day period from mid May to avoid overload for students and to eliminate subject clashes for teachers and Sub. Departments. Common Subject Department exams for year group will be set where possible. These exams must avoid a clash with Junior Cycle exams at end of May.

<u>T.Y. Assessment:</u> Mr. Dowling and Mr. Byrne have already engaged with Tutors and Management on T.Y. The Portfolio will be the key component for T.Y. end of year assessment for 2019/20. Some discussions ongoing re. T.Y. Interviews and appropriate subject specific assessments. Timetable can be arranged if required. Details will be finalized next week.

Junior Cert/Cycle.

Please read email re. J.C. exams on School Website. Management and Subject Coordinators have decided that J.C. work up to March 12th would represent 80% of the final school grade in each subject and the remaining 20% would be awarded for an end of year assessment set by Subject Departments and run by the school by dates set out recent Statement from The Minister and Guidelines from Advisory Group. More discussion on this needed at Sub. Dep. Level. Input from Parents' Association welcome. However, the Press Release and Circular does not leave too much room for manoeuvre. Our students can expect H.C.S. Based Exams to run 20th to 29th May. Parents of students with difficulty accessing the internet or a suitable device should contact the school at principal@heywood.ie.

No online Teaching & Learning engagement is expected on Tuesday 6th to facilitate Subject Department Meetings which are being convened to finalise some of the above.
